PREPARING SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

- Check with:
 - Student Services, and read Student Notices and your email for scholarship information, deadline changes, etc.
 - the particular college, institution, or university you are planning to attend to get information on specific scholarships, bursaries, etc. Many institutions publish this type of information in their calendars and on their websites.
 - your parent(s)/guardian(s)/grandparent(s) as scholarships, awards, and bursaries are often awarded through places of employment or affiliation with a specific organization, union, etc.
- READ THROUGH THE SCHOLARSHIP WELL IN ADVANCE OF THE DUE DATE.
- ***You may need to obtain endorsements, reference letters, and write personal essays. This takes time to do well. Give at least two weeks notice.***
 - PROVIDE TO YOUR REFERENCES:
 - ◆ COPIES OF THE SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA. *It is very helpful to know what to highlight in a reference letter in order to tailor it to the particular scholarship. For U of S scholarships and awards, indicate on the top right-hand corner of the reference letter which award(s) the letter should apply to.*
 - ◆ A LIST OF ADJECTIVES OR DESCRIPTIVE PHRASES THAT BEST DESCRIBE YOU. *This is helpful to writing reference letters.*
 - ◆ A PERSONAL PROFILE FORM (blank copies are available from Student Services). *Adults writing reference letters need this information in order to be specific. This will improve the quality of the reference. Some applications require a personal resume or profile.*
- **Most institutions require a formal transcript of your marks. To ensure that the transcript is completed on time, please give BJM Student Services at least two days notice.**
- PRINT NEATLY OR TYPE. *Scholarship committee members read many, many applications. Make sure yours is accurate and easy to read. If your printing is not great, type it or find someone to copy it for you.*
- SUBMIT CLEAN, COMPLETE APPLICATIONS ON TIME!!
 - *Pay attention to "must be postmarked by" or "must be received by" dates.*
 - *Check for neatness, spelling, and grammar.*
 - *Keep a copy for your own records.*
 - *Be forewarned that you may be called for an interview (telephone or in person) by the particular selection representative.*

GRADE 9 LEADERSHIP AWARD "The Troy Langer Memorial Leadership Award"

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award was founded in 1956 by His Royal Highness, The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh K.G. K.T. The Award came to Canada in 1963 and currently runs in 126 countries around the world. This is a **self directed development programme for young Canadians age 14 to 25**. The Award Programme is filled with activities that you can do in your spare time. There are three award levels to achieve; Bronze, Silver and Gold.
