St. Joseph's students prepare to go 'Halloweening for Hunger'

When young trick-or-treaters take to the streets tonight to collect pillowcases full of candy, in some neighbourhoods they will be sharing the front doorstep with students from St. Joseph High School who will be "Halloweening for Hunger."

In the Willowgrove, Silverspring, Erindale, and Forest Grove neighbourhoods, the students, clad in St. Joseph Guardian football jerseys, will be asking residents for a donation of a non-perishable food item for the Saskatoon Food Bank. This is the second year that the school's SRC has organized the project. Last year nearly 850 kilograms (2300 pounds) of food was collected and delivered to the food bank.

Food collected Wednesday night will be sorted and stored in the rotunda of the school until students deliver it to the food bank on Friday. Students, SRC members and teacher advisors will be on hand over the noon-hour.
